- FKC-016 “A woodworking shop is one of the highlights of the German prisoner of war camp at Fort Knox, and much of the furniture used in the camp is made in this shop. Planing down a piece of walnut wood which will be worked into a handsome piece of furniture is one of the German prisoners, but when asked to give his name he responded ‘Nix’, which was echoed by several other men in the shop.” SN 1403
- FKC-017 “Kurt Gerhart, a laboratory technician and artist, works in the dispensary of the German prisoner of war camp, and apparently enjoys his work. In his spare time, Kurt expresses his nostalgia for home by drawing crayon and water color landscapes.” SN 1402
- FKC-018 “Youngest German prisoner in the Fort Knox camp by his own admission is Erich Chmielecke (left) who says he is sixteen and one-half years old. Erich was captured in Normandy on the first night of the invasion, after serving in the German army four and one-half months. Explaining the American system to him is Horst Stein, (right), a member of the medical corps of the German Army and happily at work in the dispensary of the prisoner of war camp. Other youthful looking prisoners questioned had a stock reply ‘eighteen’.” SN 1405
- FKC-019 “Baking bread, rolls and cakes for 724 men is a major operation at the German prisoner of war camp, and Major John L. Warrick, above, is shown inspecting the bakery where huge cinnamon rolls are coming out of the oven. Prisoners operate the bakery as well as the other facilities of the prisoner of war camp.” SN 1407
- FKC-020 “German prisoners prefer as little clothing as the ‘law allows’, as is shown in this mess hall scene. As soon as they return from work details, they strip to shorts and shirts and spend their spare time acquiring suntans. The mess sergeant in this mess was proud of the job he does in feeding 742 men several meals a day but declined to have either his name or picture published.” SN 1408
